### **Assessing and Selecting an Innovation**

- Racial Equity Impact Assessment: This tool systematically examines how different racial and ethnic groups may be affected by a potential action or decision.
- <u>Hexagon Tool</u>: This tool uses data systematically to make informed choices about which
  evidence-based innovation will fit within a given context. This tool can also be used to
  determine the fit of a strategy once key components have been identified/developed.
- Health Equity Impact Assessment: This assessment tool can be used to identify unintended
  potential health impacts (both positive and negative) of a policy, program, or initiative on
  vulnerable/marginalized groups within the general population.

### **Prepare Infrastructure and Build Capacity**

Foundational Practices for Addressing Health Equity: This tool helps public health entities to 1) introduce a set of foundational practices to advance health equity within an organization and with partners; 2) identify and document the organization's current capabilities and practices against seven practices that provide a solid foundation for public health to advance health equity; and 3) track improvements and changes in capabilities and practices.
