



FAQ

- Do I have to have an established relationship with a Title V agency?
 - No you do not. The Center will be soliciting information from Title V agencies that are interested in supporting a Fellow for one year.
- How do I know what state/jurisdiction I will be working with?
 - The Center will solicit needs from Title V agencies and work to match the interests of the Fellow and the needs of the states/jurisdictions. An interview with the potential Fellow and state/jurisdiction may be necessary prior to acceptance.
- When does the Fellowship start?
 - June 1, 2022 – May 31, 2023
- How long does the Fellowship last?
 - 12 months
- How many Fellowships are available?
 - One
- How many hours per week are anticipated for the Fellowship?
 - An average of 4 to 5 hours per week; with some heavier and lighter work weeks, depending on the deliverables and immediate needs.
- Is there funding associated with the Fellowship? If so, how much?
 - Yes, funding is available.
 - The stipend is \$10,000
- How is the funding dispersed?
 - At least two payments of \$5,000 (end of July and January)
 - Can be adjusted as needed, depending on the needs of the Fellow and UNC-CH.
- Will this position require me to relocate or be in Chapel Hill, NC?
 - No, this position can be remote
- Will travel be required for this Fellowship?
 - Additional meetings, conferences, etc. can be done remotely or in-person, at your discretion.
- Will professional development opportunities be available (conferences, workshops, webinars, trainings, , etc.)
 - Yes. The Center provides numerous professional development opportunities for their staff and the state Title V teams. However, these will be attended voluntarily by the Fellow. In addition, depending on the interest of the Fellow and the funding available, some paid-professional development opportunities may be available. The Academic-Practice Program Coordinator, Mentor(s) of Fellow and the Fellow will collaboratively examine all opportunities. .
- Will you support an international professor with a sponsored work visa?
 - No, this Fellowship is only open to Associate or Assistant Professors from MCHB-funded Centers of Excellence in MCH (CoE), MCH Public Health Catalyst Programs (Catalyst) and MCH Leadership, Education and Advancement in Undergraduate Pathways (LEAP) Programs. in the US/jurisdictions
- Do I need to be pursuing tenure at my academic institution to be eligible?
 - No, you do not need to be pursuing tenure to be considered for the Fellowship
- When does the application window open?

- When is the application due?
 - March 1, 2022 by 5:00pm ET
- What are the scoring criteria for the application?
 - The application will be scored on 30 points. Please refer to the Scoring section above for additional information.
- Who reviews the applications?
 - Each application will be reviewed by three members of the Center team
- How long will it be between the application deadline and notification of award?
 - The successful applicant will be notified by email by the end of the day on Monday April 4, 2022.
- Will there be an informational webinar or an opportunity to ask questions prior to submitting the application?
 - Yes, the Center will hold **optional virtual office hours** on Friday, January 21, 2022 from 1pm – 3pm ET (<https://unc.zoom.us/j/4712852297>) to answer any questions from potential applicants.
