Health Transformation

- ✓ *Shifts* the emphasis of health care from *disease management to prevention* and population health management, while improving access to affordable health care

Real Life Examples

Context of Transformation

- Movement away from direct service provision toward **population health** initiatives
- Title V focus on 15 specific **performance measures**
- Stronger emphasis on the **social determinants of health**
- ACA continues to drive the **national context** of health transformation, not just insurance coverage



Your Examples

Alabama aims to:

- Analyze current service delivery model and identify opportunities for **advancing population health services**
- Prepare internal and external stakeholders for **change**
- **Build a shared vision** for expanding down the MCH pyramid, thereby reaching more children and youth with special health care needs and their families

Indiana aims to:

- **Broaden** the Indiana State Department of Health Title V portfolio of activities using a systematic approach to **strengthen partnerships, include the family voice** and create a **5-year new state action plan**

Michigan aims to:

- Develop and implement a **comprehensive evaluation plan** to enhance the Children with Special Health Care Services program's capacity to provide effective, efficient and high-quality services to its clients
- **Improve systems of care** for all children and youth with special health care needs



Your Examples

North Carolina aims to:

- **Identify the Title V role** in broader statewide opioid prevention efforts, then select and implement **collaborative strategies** in support of the broader work

Texas aims to:

- **Break down traditional silos and ways of work** in the newly formed Child and Adolescent Health Branch to build a **comprehensive, integrated approach** to nutrition strategies and initiatives

Virginia aims to:

- **Plan for, implement, scale and sustain a mental health care navigation system** for children housed in regional hubs to promote screening and facilitate access to mental health resources

Wisconsin aims to:

- **Convene partners** to examine current systems that support adolescents to **develop a shared vision** across all adolescent-serving sectors that results in sustained strategies to **address disparities** in adolescent health outcomes.
